**Art lovers in Miami's Little River help stop child slavery**

Street Art For Mankind recruits some 30 artists for massive exhibit

Miami - Street Art For Mankind is a week-long urban art event in Miami's Little River district that is focused on helping to stop child slavery.

It started on Friday with the opening of a massive exhibit of 36 canvases featuring artwork by some 30 artists - including Zark from Colombia, Dineo from Brazil, Kiriko from Mexico and nine local artists: Alex, CPL, Hooch, Kaifia, Natio Das, Remote, Sergio, Trekk and Yuhai.

**SAVE THE DATE: CHILDREN FIRST**

From blue ink and cultural gatherings, last this month's Street Art for Mankind is an important cause behind it. The festival features 10 days of interactive workshops, concerts and art projects aimed at raising funds for the Kailash Institute Children's Foundation, an organization founded by the 2014 Nobel Peace Prize winner to fight child exploitation. "Our team believes that we can trigger social change," says "Natio Das," the event's co-founder. "We are committed to young Kailash in fighting child slavery one brushstroke at a time." 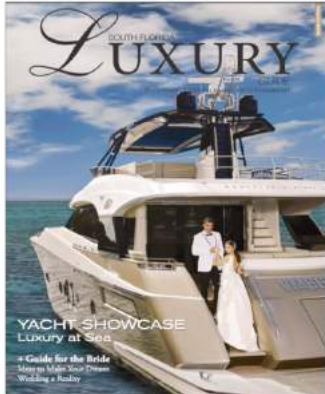

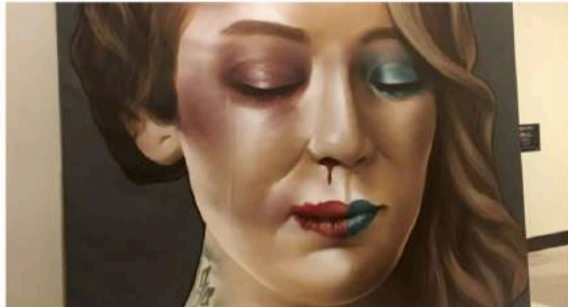
